Life of Jesus: Lesson 4, Water into Wine

Materials: Laptop, Prayer list, movies on YouTube : .

and snack.

1. Say opening prayer together; make sure to have them thank God for all their blessings and pray for others.
2. Ask if anyone has a testimony to share; they will stand up and give a testimony.
3. Inform students that we are going to continue with our unit about the Jesus. Today, we are going to continue to look at the life of Jesus. We are going to start learning about the miracles of Jesus.
4. Discuss the what we learned about what happened in the last lesson when Jesus called his 12 disciples.
5. Ask if the students know what was the first miracle that Jesus did. Talk about the wedding and how Jesus is the groom and all of us in the church are his bride.

Bring up the YouTube movie, “Jesus Turns Water Into Wine”
and watch the miracle of Jesus turning water into wine.

6. Discuss why Jesus would want to make wine for people to eat. Read over the article of “Why Jesus Turned Water Into wine.”
7. Continue to watch the Life of Jesus Christ movie from 20:49-33:08. This shows the more miracles of Jesus and how the Jewish leaders were jealous of Jesus.
8. Have two class containers. Have a little red food coloring in the bottom of the container and hold the container where the students will not see the food coloring. Have warm or hot water in the other glass.
9. Ask students if they think that you can turn water into wine. They will probably say no.
10. Pour the warm/hot water into the glass container that has the food coloring in it. Have students look at the red liquid and ask if I have turned water into wine.
11. Discuss that only Jesus and God could perform a miracle. We can do tricks to make it look like it is a miracle, but only God/Jesus can do a miracle.
12. Show how you made the “wine” and allow students to make it with red powder drink mix. They may drink this with their snack.

13. Students may play with the magnetic fishing game to fish for men (the 12 disciples).

14. Students will practice singing the song, "There Were 12 Disciples".

15. Students will have a snack, put money in collection, say closing prayer, and draw a prize from the cabinet.
