- 1. ZION sometimes refers to a part of old Jerusalem

 - c. most of David's Psalms
- 2. ZION & CITY OF JERUSALEM they are often synonymous
 - d. Zechariah 1:12-17
 - e. Micah 4:1-7 (Isaiah 2:2-4)
 - f. Book of Commandments 48:33-37, 59-67
- 3. <u>ZION & NEW JERUSALEM</u> they sometimes refer to the whole "land" of which New Jerusalem is the capitol
 - g. 2 Nephi 7:17-20
 - h. 3 Nephi 9:49-69
- 4. NEW JERUSALEM a city to be built on this land
 - i. 3 Nephi 10:1-5
 - j. Ether 6:4-8
- 5. NEW JERUSALEM a city to come from heaven after the millennium
 - k. Revelations 21:1-27
 - 1. Ether 6:2-3, 9-10
- A. At this time, Jerusalem was not yet the capital of Israel. David took control and it became known as the City of David.
- B. This is prophesy of the coming of Jesus to Jerusalem.
- C. This implies two places, however it is hard to establish them as Jerusalem and Zion without modern day revelation. Modern day revelation including the Book of Mormon.
- D. In verses 1 and 2 we see events in the last days of which Zion will be established among many governments on a mountain top. In verses 3 and 4 we find a New Jerusalem established in two places during the Millennial Reign of Christ. In verse 7, "remnant" refers to "Jews" and those of the House of Israel. This may refer to those of the Americas and the New Jerusalem here.
- E. This is a time reference for the establishment of New Jerusalem or Zion.

- F. Here Zion is not just a city, but the whole land of the Americas; of which the New Jerusalem and/or Zion is the capital.
- G. Verse 58 establishes there will be a New Jerusalem on this land among this people. From verse 68 we see that this covenant extends to all of the House of Israel. This applies to the whole land as well as the city.
- H. The first "New" Jerusalem will be built upon this land and then the work goes to the rest of the House of Israel and the old Jerusalem and the lands of Israel will be reestablished. Currently, much of this land is in the control of the Arab nations.
- I. The New Jerusalem is built here on this land (the Americas) with its center at Missouri. Continue reading through verse 12 and we find that in the New Jerusalem all things will be new, but like unto the old. It therefore seems that we will still have houses, families, work, etc., like there have always been; although they will be new.
- J. This is the final New Jerusalem, which comes from God out of heaven. There will be no temple in this city, because God and Christ will dwell there among the saints. There will be no sea, no sun and no night. The New Jerusalem will be 1362 miles long, 1362 miles wide and 1362 miles high. There will be a wall 261 feet high around it.
- K. Verifies Revelation 21.

- \underline{f} Here Zion is not just a city, but the whole land of the Americas; of which the New Jerusalem and/or Zion is the capital.
- g Verse 58 establishes there will be a New Jerusalem on this land amoung this people. From verse 68 we see that this covenant extends to all of the House of Israel. This applies to the whole land as well as the city.
- \underline{h} The first "New" Jerusalem will be built upon this land and then the work goes to the rest of the House of Israel and the old Jerusalem and the lands of Israel will be reestablished. Currently, much of this land is in the control of the Arab nations.
- i The New Jerusalem is built here on this land (the Americas) with its center at Missouri. Continue reading through verse 12 and we find that in the New Jerysalem all things will be new, but like unto the old. It therefore seems that we will still have houses, families, work, etc., like there have always been; although they will be new.
- j This is the final New Jerusalem, which comes from God out of heaven. There will be no temple in this city, because God and Christ will dwell there amoung the saints. There will be no sea, no sun and no night. The New Jerusalem will be 1362 miles long, 1362 miles wide and 1362 miles high. There will be a wall 261 feet high around it.
- k Verifies Revelation 21.
