The Brother of Jared-Lesson 1 of 2

Ether 1,3,6 Genesis 10:32, 11:1-9 2200-2000 B.C.

Read: <u>The Brother of Jared</u>, the first ten pages, or wherever you feel comfortable leaving off.

Discuss: The power of prayer is the theme here. The Brother of Jared had a lot of faith. The Lord had mercy on him and his friends and family because of his prayers.

- -Always remember to pray!
- The Lord is always listening! He knows what is good for us, so we don't always get what we prayed for. If He knows what we prayed for will be a good blessing for us, He will grant it, according to His will. "...If we ask anything according to His will, he heareth us;" 1 John 5:14

Can you think of a blessing you asked for? Did the Lord give it to you?

Create: Barges

Materials: Two disposable Styrofoam or paper bowls, stapler, pencil, one crayon, paint & paintbrush (optional), small clear stones (optional) and glow in the dark paint (optional).

Directions:

- 1. Put one bowl down on the table. Flip the other bowl upside-down, placing it directly on top of the other bowl, so the edges match up.
- 2. Staple around the edges.
- 3. Use the pencil to poke holes in the center of the top bowl and the bottom bowl.
- 4. Optional paint your barge, and decorate it!
- 5. Break the crayon in half, and wedge each half into both the top hole and bottom hole.
- 6. Another option is to paint two clear glass "stones" with glow in the dark paint, and after they are dry, place them inside the barges. I don't know what to call them, but you see they have these at the dollar store. They are small, clear glass stones that are flat on the bottom.
