

The Brother of Jared Part 2 of 2

Read: The last half of the Brother of Jared story. Pick up where you left off last week.

Discuss: One of the themes towards the end of this story is “praising God no matter what.” The Jaredites sang songs to the Lord the whole day and night, even though it must have been the most horrible living conditions inside of those barges. (No bathing for nearly a year...bathroom messes....vomiting...) Everyone could have been so cranky, but they did not complain, and they praised God!

Service Project: As you have noticed, (and I am sure the kids have definitely noticed, this story was not illustrated!) I would like for each student to illustrate a page of this story. With parents’ permission, I will use them in the actual publication. For the sake of making things easier, I will assign each student their page, so they are age-appropriate. They can switch assignments if they wish, just so long as no one does the same one twice.

Materials Needed: Pencils, Colored pencils, a thin black drawing marker, a large eraser, 8 1/2 x 11 blank white paper.

Directions: To make all of the pictures look somewhat uniform, here are some loose directions to follow:

1. Draw first with a regular pencil.
2. When your drawing is complete, trace over it with a thin black drawing marker.
3. Use the large eraser to erase any pencil marks that are showing.
4. Color in with the colored pencils.
