

The People of Ammon

Read: The People of Ammon by Jay Davis.

Discuss: What did this story teach us? There can be many answers, but the main theme here is **obedience!**

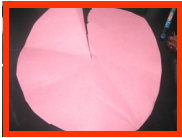
Sing: “Trust and Obey” from the Zion’s Hymnal. There is piano music available on CD, thanks to our dear Sister Michelle Yates.

Create: The angel of the Lord who came to Alma:

Materials: White construction paper, pencil, scissors, glue stick or stapler, yarn. Optional– googly eyes or small buttons, to use for eyes, stickers for decoration, feathers.

Directions:

1. Draw a large circle on the construction paper.
2. Cut it out.
3. Draw a line from the center of the circle out to one side, and cut.
4. Take one side, and curl it around and around until it becomes a cute little cone shape. The kids will probably need some help with this step.



5. This is the bottom of the angel. The kids can decorate it with stickers, etc.
6. Draw a much smaller circle, for the angel’s head.
7. Cut out.
8. Draw faces onto the heads, and if you have googly eyes or small buttons, they will make cute eyes.
9. Cut a few pieces of yarn the same length, and glue on for hair.
10. Staple the base of the angel’s head to the top of the cone.
11. You can also glue feathers onto the back of the cone, for wings. It doesn’t specifically mention in the B of M whether or not this angel has wings, so this step is up to you.



Suggested Service Project: Plan for the kids to give a special in front of the church, and sing “Trust and Obey.” Tell the church a little about the lesson, and let the kids show everyone their angels.
